Katie Tilford- The WWW of Wildflowers

California Native Wildflowers
Katie Tilford is the assistant Director of the Theodore Payne Foundation for Wild Flowers and Native Plants in Sun Valley, California. The Theodore Payne Foundation inspires and educates Southern Californians about the beauty and ecological benefits of California Native Landscapes.



Katie is an Orange County native, a certified horticulturist and passionate about popularizing botanical knowledge. Katie leads botanical courses at the Foundation's beautiful twenty acre nursery and speaks regionally about the Foundation's beautiful twenty acre nursery and speaks regionally about the Foundation's gardens, nursery, classes and resources. Her first fundraising experience was at her college radio station, KUCI in Irvine, doing the annual

fund drive to support their operations. She started working at Theodore Payne Foundation for Wild Flowers and Native Plants in 2020 out of a love for gardens and nature. She got contacted COVID and her slow recovery prevented her from keeping up with the physical aspects of the job. Confined to a desk, she started looking into the administrative side of things, and found ways to improve their customer database and membership/donation processes. "Being in Los Angeles and having an amazing community of plant lovers, we are lucky to have lots of chance interactions that can lead up to bigger things. For example, pro skater Lizzie Armanto started visiting our nursery in the last couple of years, and that led to us releasing a skateboard deck with her that features native plants and animals. At the same time, we are keeping some old traditions from our 60+ year history alive, like our Wildflower Hotline which is currently in its 41st year. **For us, it's important to strike a balance of much-loved traditions and new opportunities that still align with the mission.**"

Tis the Season For Giving to Others

The Garden Club will be collecting donations for Spark of Love Toy Drive. At the December 13 meeting, there will be a table inside Tankersley Hall for you to drop off new, unwrapped toys or sports equipment. We will drop off the toys at the Fire Station after the meeting.

The Laguna Beach Fire Department, in partnership with Southern California Firefighters and ABC7, is again taking part in the annual “Spark of Love” Toy Drive. The campaign collects new, unwrapped toys and sports equipment for underserved children and teens in Orange, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Ventura, and Riverside counties. Toys collected in the respective counties are distributed locally.

This year marks the 32nd anniversary of the Firefighters’ “Spark of Love” campaign, which will run through December 24. The Laguna Beach Fire Department has been involved since the program’s inception.

Any new, unwrapped toy must be in its original packaging or box. Sports equipment (balls, tennis racquets, baseball bats, etc.) is not required to have a box or package. The fire department cannot distribute clothing, personal care items, blankets, etc. The toy drive cannot accept clothing, personal care items, or blankets.

Items for older children are in high demand.

Or if you so choose you can drop off your new, unwrapped toys or sports equipment to any of Laguna Beach’s four fire stations through December 24.

Kindness Shown & Felt 55 Years Later

There are times that we have wondered if the little acts of volunteering make a difference. I know that I have pondered this many times. In the ordinary task of checking the inquiries into the Laguna Beach Garden Club's website we received an email from a gentleman thanking us for our service back in 1969!

Doug Pugh is a veteran of the Vietnam war who returned from service in 1969. Veterans who returned from Vietnam often faced a difficult homecoming, experiencing a lack of public support and sometimes hostility, as the war was highly divisive in American society, leading to many feeling isolated and struggling to readjust to civilian life; unlike veterans from other wars, they were typically not greeted with parades or celebratory welcomes, often being seen as a reminder of a "lost" war.

Doug had enlisted at the age of 17 in his home state of Kansas where the arrangement was that if you enlisted at 17 you could be finished with your service in 2 years. Doug did one year in the United States and one year in Vietnam. Thankfully Doug made it home in 1969. At that time returning veterans came through the El Toro Airbase upon returning to the US. When Doug and the other veterans got off the plane there were many ladies of the **Laguna Beach Garden Club** to greet the arriving soldiers. Doug said that he and the other men were thrilled to be received with so much warmth and love.

Doug described the feelings that he got from the woman club members that greeted all the men felt like these women were greeting their own sons back from the war. The anxiety he and the other men had felt about returning was washed away with the love and joy that these ladies showed.

The Laguna Beach Garden Club is no stranger to getting involved with patriotic efforts. In 1942 when the country was deep into World War II, the ladies of the garden club placed all their efforts into enthusiastically getting the town to dig victory gardens. In 1944 when men returned from war injured the club worked on succulent gardens for the bed-side tables for the disabled in the SAAAB hospital. The club also sponsored collections of shrubs and quick growing trees for landscaping the Air Corp replacement Training Center in Costa Mesa.

Doug sent the email to say thanks for what the club had done for him. He said he wished he had done it sooner, but the members of the current generation of LBGC members are thrilled that he waited 55 years so that they could have the excitement of knowing his great story. The Laguna Beach Garden Club says, "Doug, thank you for your service"!

On November 15 Past President **Jane Leary** delivered a \$1500 grant to **Joe Stead and Magali Martinez** of Orange Coast College for gardening supplies to support the 200-250 students in OCC's horticulture program.

Students can earn certificates and AA degrees in subjects like soil science, plant propagation, plant science and plant and tree identification all designed to help students get good paying jobs at botanical gardens, large estates (think Sunnylands in Palm Springs) and hotel gardens (like the beautiful gardens at the Montage) taking them way beyond the mow-blow-go level.

The OCC horticulture department is a beautiful 1.5 acres filled with a variety of plants and trees, 90 garden plots tended by students growing all manner of fruits and vegetables, along with 7 greenhouses, 3 of which are aquaponics where they grow food with no soil and use fish to fertilize the plants! It's fascinating and uses very little water as it is recycled and used within the system.

Joe Stead and his team were *thrilled* with our donation which will go a long way in helping insure their students' success.
