The past few weeks have found us spending more time indoors due to the rains and Holiday festivities. Your indoor plants can benefit from the extra attention they can receive during this time. Here are 10 simple tweaks from *Garden Design* to keep yours healthy through winter and ready for spring, like watering less (most

plants grow more slowly right now) and boosting humidity with a pebble tray or humidifier. Easy win: rotate pots a quarter-turn when you water so they don't lean toward the light. Enjoy your indoor gardening!

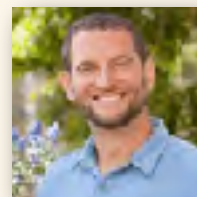

January Guest Speaker Ari Novy

"Plants Are (Almost) Everything"

Dr. Ari Novy, the San Diego Botanical Garden's President and CEO, is not just a plant biologist. His amazing career spans from an estate gardener in Italy to sustainable gardening in the Philippines to Executive Director of the U.S. Botanic Garden, to name a few! Many of our members recently raved about their experience with Dr. Novy, touring the 37-acre garden with an extensive collection of Mediterranean climate plants as well as award winning children's gardens.

Dr. Novy is a plant biologist with a wide range of expertise in plant science and education. He started his career in student support services with New York University. Dr. Novy completed his graduate work at Rutgers University in New Jersey, where he conducted research on plant population genetics, invasive species, plant conservation, horticultural improvement, agronomic risk assessment, beekeeping management, plant evolution and agricultural economics and policy.

Dr. Novy remains an active researcher, holding an appointment as Adjunct Associate Professor at the Salk Institute for

Biological Studies. He is the founding co-chair of the Food & Agriculture Professional Section of the American Public Gardens Association. He has served on task forces and advisory panels



for diverse groups including the White House Council on Environmental Quality. He is immensely proud of having been a science advisor for the most recent seasons of "The Magic School Bus".

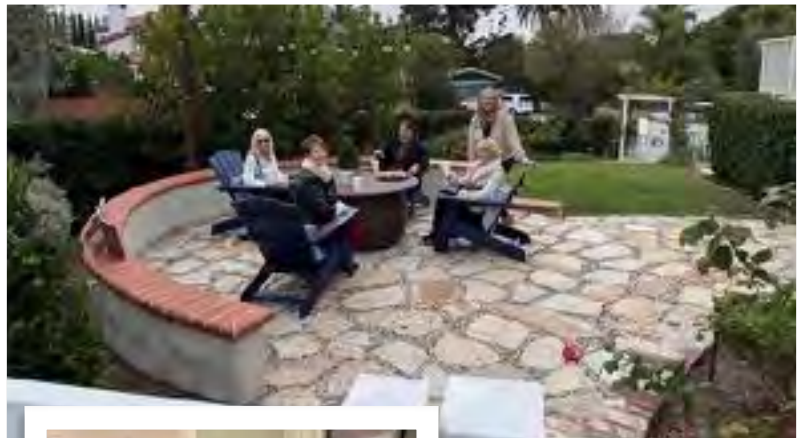
Annual Holiday Member Tour

Cranberry White Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

2/3 cup softened butter
2/3 cup brown sugar
2 eggs
1 1/2 cups oatmeal
1 1/2 cups flour
1 tsp baking soda
1/2 tsp salt
1 cup cranberries
1 cup white chocolate chips

Directions -

Preheat oven to 375 degrees
Combine butter & sugar in a large bowl & then add eggs.
In a separate bowl: combine oatmeal, flour, baking soda & salt.
Slowly mix the oatmeal & flour into butter mixture.
Stir in the cranberries & white chocolate chips.
Bake for 8-9 minutes.
Makes 3 dozen
