Savor the Seasons in Your Garden

Well, shiver my briskets but it is cold and soggy out there! Last week I planted and pruned, and this weekend I was going to fertilize my fruit trees except that Mother Nature clearly wants to keep me in my comfy armchair, reading! By the end of next week I will doubtless have a fine crop of weeds to deal with. However, weeding is one of my favorite garden tasks, so bring them on.

I may grumble about the rain, but thank goodness we have had so much this year. We still live in a very dry part of the world and climate change is



already having a huge impact. The number of trees that have died in our state is overwhelming, and the over use of groundwater is making things worse in the main agricultural areas; so when you plant this Spring be waterwise, use mulch, and switch to drip irrigation.

My native garden is in its third year and there are only a few gaps to fill in, but I am leaving some open areas for our native bees to nest.

Nowadays, names for the guest list are put forward by the government, the armed services, and different charities. The dress code is still formal with men wearing morning suits and ladies wearing dresses and hats or fascinators. Meet Ruben Flores and Laguna Nursery

Ruben was born and raised in Southern California in the San Gabriel Valley where he was one of five kids where there was always something going on and projects to do. In 5th grade he tended his own large (80'x80'), and bountiful vegetable garden in hot, windy Rialto; and in his early teens he started caring for his neighbor's gardens, including trees, shrubs, flowers, orchids, and their vegetable gardens. He has always been fascinated by diverse growing conditions, taking notice of the tiny flowering plant on a rocky hillside and wondering how it survives and even flourishes. Immediately after high school, he enrolled in Cal Poly Pomona, where he earned a BS degree in Ornamental Horticulture and MA degree in Business with an emphasis in Marketing. He has been working in the horticulture field since graduation in 1983.



One of his first jobs in Laguna Beach began with happenstance meeting with a local landscape architect. Early in his career, Ruben was giving lectures at various universities on his thesis - Coastal Plants in Southern California. A member of the audience met him afterward and asked for Ruben's help on a property that he was designing, Villa Elena, located on the ocean side of Coast Highway across the street from the hospital. He quickly learned the difference between a landscape architect and an ornamental horticulturist; the former focuses on hardscape and design (possibly using a block wall and then covering with a vine), whereas the latter solves issues of retaining walls or fences with plants, trees, and shrubs, whose roots go deep in the soil to stabilize the hillside or provide privacy.



One of his revelations/inspirations came as a result from a visit to a huge farm (40 acres) in Hawaii where they only use organic materials as barriers. For example, to keep the animals from foraging on the farm produce, they created a four-foot-wide barrier of rosemary, lavender, lemongrass, and lemon verbena. The aroma of the plants plus the depth of the growth prevented the animals from entering or seeing through and trying to force their way through to the produce on the farm. This was a lesson on how to execute barriers without using hardscape, being more environmentally conscious. One plant that is helpful on steep slopes is groupings of asparagus ferns because their bulbous, fibrous roots stabilize erosion. Trim the tops back yearly to reduce the canopy; they will regrow and thus enabling the root system to continue to grow.

Ruben offers an alternative to turf or the undesirable artificial turf – use oregano. It only

requires watering twice a year, and it wards off rabbits and gophers. It can be “mowed” with a hedge cutter or weed whacker and can be walked on. Another landscape suggestion is to plant macadamia nut trees. Once established (within the first year), they only need watering every ten years. The tree provides beautiful flowers, delicious fruits, shade, and hummingbirds love the flowers.

His philosophy as a horticulturist is always asking “how am I filling up that space for the long term?” Use natural materials; everything in moderation; do don’t be selfish; and give back to nature. Beautification should be the key.

He bought his home in Laguna Beach in 1997. His landscape company, **VisionScape**, has allowed him to work in 15 different countries, giving him the joy of traveling and experiencing different cultures and how they address horticulture issues, which include: drought, heat, steep grades, or strong winds. It also provides ideas on how to take advantage of local resources and tackle problems, such as paving, plantings, watering, art, views or outdoor entertaining. VisionScape offers landscape consultations.



His travels also offer opportunities to bring some fabulous specimens back to the States for his customers at Laguna Nursery to use in their newly inspired gardens or to enhance their established ones. The inspiration for Ruben’s vision of his own nursery came from such places as Tavern on the Green in NYC, Roger’s Gardens in Corona del Mar, the Organerie at Versailles, Kew Gardens in London, and the Alhambra in Spain. He first opened Laguna Nursery in 2008 with a wish of creating a



boutique nursery that is magical, inspirational, and a whimsical place filled with frivolity that specializes in true organic gardening. He wants customers to feel joy. The nursery is filled with items from around the world and in every price range: items from movie sets and theater/television props; plants, fountains, statuary, home goods and so much more. Ruben tries to bring things into the nursery that he would use in design of a garden he would install; exterior design such as contemporary, cottage, traditional, Mediterranean, California sleek. He strongly believes in mixing in a piece of strong antiquity with a modern setting; mid-century end table or low-slung sofa or

adding an urn of a particular color that blends with the décor. Visiting Laguna Nursery is like walking into a museum, but the items are things you can bring home.

The original location of the nursery began in 2008, located on Coast Hwy in the village areas of town, when the property became available. When he was painting some of the structure, his mother reminded him of visiting Laguna Beach as a child and his insistence as a toddler of walking through

the rows of ground cover and flowers planted in the ground outside the nursery. That distant memory flooded back to him in the realization that he now owns that same nursery.

The nursery has since moved to its current location at 481 N. Coast Hwy, near Myrtle Street; the sense of joy is definitely apparent when one enters. The nursery offers everything other nurseries have and focuses on plants that grow in Laguna Beach:

- trees (peach, apple, citrus, Australian finger limes, strawberry trees, avocado, macadamia nut)
- herbs
- seasonal veggies
- seeds
- flowers



Ruben has been a longtime supporter of Laguna Beach Garden Club, dating back to the 1990s. The club members are some of the nicest people, who possess the qualities of down-to earth kindness and philosophy of not stressing if a plant doesn't come in on time, eventually it will bloom. Ruben has been an official member of the club since 2013. He has helped many members with their individual gardens. A short list of Ruben's contributions to the club include: designing Sister Cities Garden (selecting the plants that Three Sister Cities have in common with Laguna and assisting with the actual planting); volunteering his time to guide us who write on rocks to ID the plants in each garden on the Gate & Garden Tour; connecting with homeowners of fabulous local gardens to recommend potential gardens for the Gate & Garden Tour; sponsoring the Gate & Garden Tour in 2022 and upcoming 2023; and donating to raffles for the club.



Ruben is also active in Laguna Beach. He was president of Laguna Beach Beautification Council for 5 years; is actively involved in South Laguna Community Garden; is working with the city to involve the club in refurbishing Jahraus Park (across the street from the Art Museum), which has the potential for a garden park with shaded small amphitheater; is a member of many other professional organizations.



So remember Laguna Nursery and all it has to offer.

Ruben is planning a trip to the Flower Fields in Carlsbad on Saturday, March 25. Call the nursery for details.

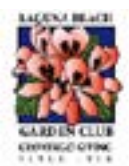
