I wasn't always a landscape architect specializing in affordable, low-water gardens in a wide range of styles. While enjoying a successful career as an LA studio drummer, I discovered the world of plants via bonsai and Japanese gardens. My studies in ornamental horticulture led to work in nursery sales, landscape installation, garden maintenance and design.



Frustrated with my limited arsenal — and increasingly frequent visits to the chiropractor — I returned to school and earned a degree with honors in landscape architecture from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and landed a



sweet gig as City Landscape Architect for Santa Barbara.

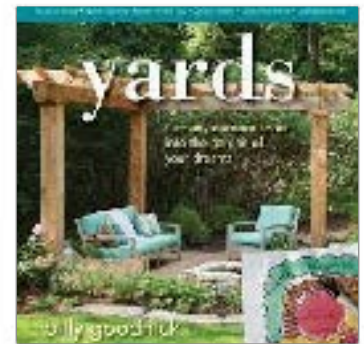
My 20+ years of work with the Parks & Recreation Department included designing and managing the construction of parks, playgrounds and public gardens and developing policies that continue to enhance the public spaces of one of the world's most beautiful cities.

Not one to sit on my haunches, in 1990, I developed an entertaining and informative adult education class to demystify garden design for homeowners, then took a teaching position at the local community college. I co-created and hosted the public TV show *Garden Wise Guys* (now *Garden Wise*) and in 2013, authored a highly popular book on residential landscape design. *Yards: Turn Any Outdoor Space Into the Garden of Your Dreams*, St. Lynn's Press, was a popular hit and led to lectures at



botanical gardens and appearances at garden shows around the country. Throughout these years, I built my landscape consulting business to serve homeowners in the greater Santa Barbara area.

LBGC's Major Fundraiser, AKA It takes a Village

We all know about this club's fabulous Gate & Garden Tour. But do you know the rich history of the tour? Do you have any idea about the months of preparation and the hundreds of hours and volunteers that make this happen? I will give you description of a year in the life of planning a colossal tour!

The Gate & Garden tour was started by one our favorite members, **Nancy Englund**, who dreamed of a "walking tour". Nancy developed the tour into a once a year event in May to show off Laguna's gardens at their finest hour. The warmth and love that Nancy shows to all of us was a hallmark of her tours, and drew the attention of the entire community, and built the reputation that continues to exist today. After many years of taking on this task, she was tapped to be President. Nancy's skill as a gardener, married with her ease with people, made her a perfect match. In 2018 I had the honor of shadowing Nancy who taught me the tricks of the tour and I decided to follow in her footsteps and take the tour on as my own. I decided to try to make it bigger and more profitable in order to assist our club's efforts to reach out to the community in our scholarship and community project efforts. I brought on sponsors and found us a forever-venue in the Laguna Beach County Water District. I was struck by good fortune when a lovely brand new retiree named **Susan Denton** walked into one of our meetings for the very first time. I happened to be volunteer wrangling on that day and managed to get her to take over the entire task known as "ticketing". She was fabulous at it and got us on to the super-efficient Eventbrite system that is now our standard.



Susan has brought a level of organization to our event that rivals a Fortune 500 company! Every task is orchestrated and each committee is completely prepared to meet their challenges. Susan is a wonderful leader, tireless, thoughtful yet very decisive, which is a key to success. She has grown ticket sales from the 450 to close to over 700+ this year. *Laguna Beach Garden Club* is incredibly lucky to have such a talented member that is so willing to share her skills with all of us.

The planning for this event starts a month or two after the tour ends in May. Sponsors need to be found, budgets need to be made, homeowners need to be charmed and cajoled into allowing their private spaces to have several hundred guests. These things take months of work with several times a month scouting walks to find the best location that has gardens that have not been visited before. By January of tour year the entire marketing and advertising strategy is launched and the machine begins to churn its



way to tour day! **Carolyn Bent**, who is the “pure magic” behind all our graphic needs for ads, signs, posters, flyers, banners and whatever other crazy stuff we think up, is truly the one that makes our public face be so polished and professional. She never becomes impatient with our dozens of changes and edits and is always open to hearing new ideas. **Without Carolyn’s help the tour would definitely not have been voted one of LA Times top 10 garden tours in Southern California.**

So now you are fully versed in what it takes to create the magical event that we all get to take ownership of, the major fundraiser for the Laguna Beach Garden Club. Susan Denton and I have decided to join forces and co-chair the event for 2023 & 2024. I am fortunate to have worked with her since 2019 and now am honored to count her as a very close friend. See the great things that can happen when you just jump in, volunteer and meet the wonderful people in this club!

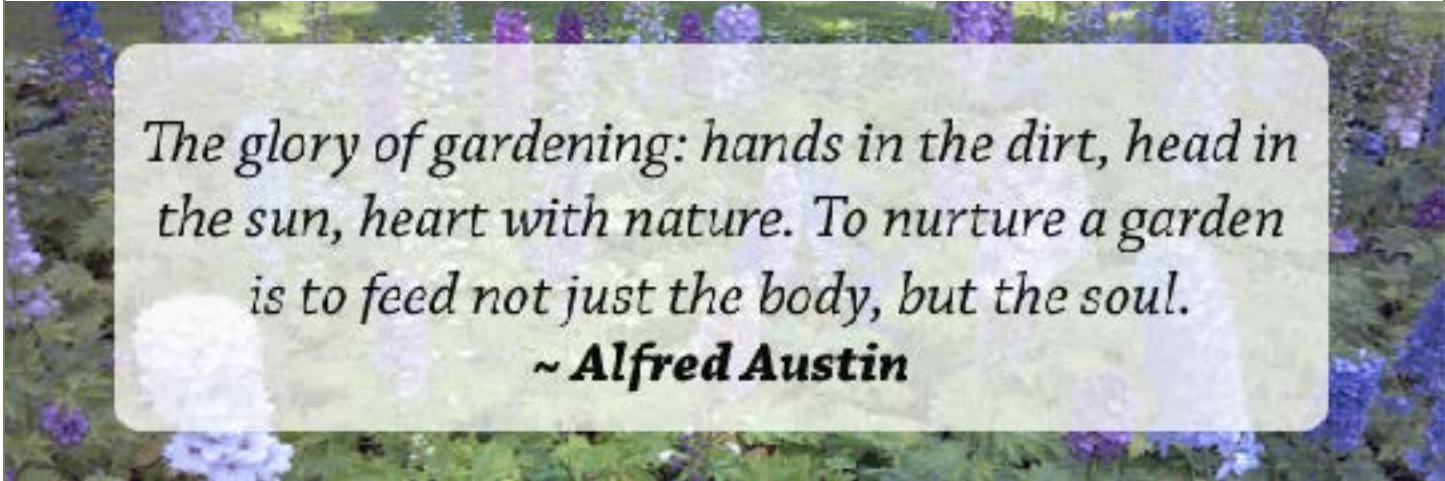
